

CURRICULUM AND COURSES

1. The School follows semester system to enable the pupils to learn with ease.
2. English is the medium of instruction, in all classes, Hindi is second compulsory language. However, Sanskrit is taught as third language from VI Standard onwards.

Computer Science is also given impetus and taught from class I onwards to enable the students to have a first hand knowledge to step confidently into today's world of computers.

3. With restoration of class X Board examination, the CBSE will issue report card for class X based on the Board examination with effect from Academic Year 2017-18. As the assessment structure and examination pattern for class IX will be similar to that of class X, the report card for class IX issued by the schools should also be similar to that of class X.
4. As the CBSE affiliated schools are required to follow the NCERT syllabus in the upper primary stage, uniformity in the assessment structure, examination and issue of report cards across all the affiliated schools is felt necessary below for easy understanding and implementation.

4.1 Scholastic Area : The assessment Structure and examination for classes VI to VIII have been prepared in view of the provisions of RTE-Act 2009 and comprises of two terms i.e. Term-1 and 2 as explained below:

Kindergarten

1. The academic year commencing in June consists of three terms. The first, and second terminal examination will generally be held in the month of September and December and the Annual Examination in the month of March.
2. The promotion of a child does not depend merely on his/her marks of the annual examination, but also on his/her performance throughout the year.

For Classes I to VIII

1. There will be two term-end examinations (September and March).
2. Each term will have a periodical test out of 20 marks with 10 % Weightage (July & December)
3. Each term examination will be conducted out of 80 marks.
4. Each term will be consists of 5 marks for note book submission and 5 marks for subject enrichment activities.
5. The annual report card will reflect the marks and grades of 1st and 2nd term separately .
6. **For classes VI to VIII :** The syllabus of 2nd term-end 30 % of syllabus of the 1st term for the classes VI, VII & VIII respectively.
7. In order to develop a habit of text book reading 10% questions in Std I and II , 15% questions in STD III - V and 20% questions in Std VI-Viii will be from within the textbook.
8. For the holistic development of the students co-curriculum activities will be carried out in
(a) Work Education (b) Art Education and (c) Health and Physical Education. Grades will be provided on a 3 point grading scale (A = Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair).

3. Each periodical test includes the entire syllabus till the date the exam starts.

Senior Secondary

1. The academic year commencing in April consists of three terms. the first and second terminal examination will generally be held in the month of September and December and the Annual Examination in the month of March. Besides the terminal examination periodic tests will be conducted as per the schedule given.

2. The Promotion of a child does not depend merely on his/her marks of the annual examination, but also on his/her performance throughout the year i.e.30% of the marks of terminal examination and 20% of periodic tests will also be counted for promotion.
3. In Higher Secondary it is mandatory that students should pass in theory and practical separately.
4. All pupil failing twice in the same classes from IX to Xii will not be allowed to continue his/her studies in the school.

Subjects like Value Education, General Knowledge and Computer will be assessed internally and grades will be awarded. No re-assessment will be conducted in any subject.

5. The promotion of a child does not depend merely on his/her marks of annual examination but also on his/her performance throughout the year , certain percentage of the marks of terminal assessment , U.P. and model assessment will also be counted for promotion.
6. All cases of doubt regarding promotion are left entirely to the decision of the Principal . Her decision will be final **A PUPIL FAILING TWICE IN THE SAME CLASS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CONTINUE HIS/HER STUDIES IN THE SCHOOL.** The principal reserves the right of demanding withdrawal of any Pupil.

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

Admission is open to all and will be based on the entrance test and interview. The age of admission to Play Group is 2 or above, Nursery is 3 years, Children above 3^{1/2} to 4 year are admitted to L.K.G. Usually students will not be admitted in Std X and XII. Those who desire to enroll for the first time in Nursery or K.G. classes are required to produce valid documents to verify the correct date of birth. Students seeking admission from Std. 1 onwards are required to bring T.C. and Progress Card from the school he or she last attended. Fresh students should submit Xerox copy of Birth Certificate.

Parents also will be interviewed for their understanding of the type of education offered in the school and to see their ability to co-operate in it. Every child for admission must be introduced in person to the Principal by parents or legal guardians. The name and date of birth of the child once entered cannot be altered thereafter.

WITHDRAWAL

1. **Withdrawal on parent's request:** Students are accepted for admission with the understanding that they will remain in the school for the entire duration of their school studies, they should however, be withdrawn due to personal reasons, parents will have to pay the school fees in accordance with the school rules.
2. If a parent requests the withdrawal of his/her child from the school after six months of the academic year i.e. anytime after September the remaining fees of the year should be paid for the issuance of the Transfer Certificate.
3. At least one calendar month's notice must be given in writing before the student is withdrawn, failing which a month's fees will be required to be paid in lieu thereof. Parents who are planning to withdraw their children at the end of the year must apply for T.C before the annual results are declared.
Duplicates of transfer certificates Will not be issued unless the request is supported by an affidavit, stating reason for the request, with the prescribed fee.

A transfer certificate will be issued only when all dues to the school have been paid off.

WITHDRAWAL ON DISPLINARY GROUNDS:

The Principal can, without assigning any reason, ask a parent/guardian to withdraw his child/ward from the school and if the Principal considers the child's conduct, behavior or influence to be in any way detrimental to the interest of the school.

A month's notice must be given in writing by parents or guardians before a child is withdrawn, otherwise the fee for the next month will be charged.

Transfer certificate will be issued after the payment of all the school dues.

The Principal has the right to refuse continuation of studies to any pupil whose conduct or attendance is unsatisfactory.

DISCIPLINE

1. Special attention is given to maintain a high standard on morality and discipline in the school .Parents are requested to co- operate with the school authorities by insisting on regular attendance, punctuality, neatness of person and dress.
2. Pupils are reminded to show respect to their teachers and to all members of the staff. On their way to and from School, they are expected to behave themselves in gentle manly way.
3. No students shall leave the School premises during School hours or recess without the **PREVIOUS PERMISSION OF THE PRINCIPAL** .
4. Students are not permitted to enter any classroom other than their own unless accompanied by a teacher.
5. During the absence of the teachers, the class-monitor will be responsible for the order and discipline of the class.

6. Running or shouting inside the School building should be avoided. Damage or disfigurement of any kind done to the School property will have to be made good. The students should avoid writing on the School furniture or scribbling on the walls of the school and Toilets .
7. Deepti School expects personal cleanliness from all pupils. The uniform must be clean and neatly dressed, shoes well cleaned and polished, nails pared and hair trimmed and neatly arranged. Shaggy, unkempt hair or dirty shoes may earn for the owner's demerits.
8. All should take an honest pride in keeping the School premises clean. Be very careful not to litter the compound and the road-side.
9. Besides one's Text-Books and School Library Books no other books (Newspaper, magazines, comics, any CD's, Pendrives) is to be brought to school without the express permission of the Principal. If such be addressed to pupils, they will be subject to inspection by School authorities. The School is not responsible for goods lost.
10. No collection or subscription of any kind is to be made in the School . No meetings , social or picnics, may be arranged without the express permission of the Principal .
11. Students, who are unable to take part in the physical training, must produce an application signed by their parents.
12. Every student must have his own copy of the School Diary for his guidance. He/She shall bring to school everyday.
13. Students who come late to school will enter into the Regularity Record of their Diary the exact time of their arrival, show it to the Principal and then proceed to the classroom concerned.
14. Smoking, Pan Parag, Pan, chewing-gum, drugs are strictly forbidden.

15. **Mobile phones are strictly forbidden** to be brought in the school premises. If anyone is caught, they will have to pay for the dire consequences
16. Children are not allowed to bring motorcycles to the school.
17. Students are responsible to conduct themselves well in and outside the school. Hence Misbehaviour in public places, streets and conveyances are sufficient reasons for **dismissal** from school.
18. In view of the high standard of English required for the CBSE Examinations, English will be spoken at all time in the school premises as a further opportunity for practice.
19. a) With the consent of Principal, any teacher can award '+ 1 mark' to students each time they do some highly meritorious acts. These marks will be added to the FA/SA results on the following grounds
20. No. collection of any kind for any purpose whatsoever may be made from the student or staff without the permission of the principal. Similarly no meeting, party or picnic or any kind of organized school activity shall be arranged without the previous approval of the principal. Parents are earnestly requested to make no personal gifts to staff members.
- b) Any teacher can give '-1 mark' and deduct that mark from the monthly/terminal results on the following grounds :
 1. Act of indiscipline at any time and any place.
 2. Absence without leave.
 3. Negligence in performing home tasks.
 4. Violation of school rules, especially the rule of language

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Uniform symbolizes unity, equality and discipline. Therefore it must be respected and kept neat and tidy. The school uniform is compulsory on all the class days and at every school functions and even at the result & parents teachers meeting. School Tie, belt and House T-shirt will be supplied from the school office. School uniforms are available in the market.

All pupils should be clean and neatly dressed. Boys should see to it that their hair is well groomed and trimmed at regular intervals.

UNIFORMS

Children should wear the prescribed uniform on all working days.

Boys : Marron shorts / Pants, Cream shirt, Half Sleeves, Maroon tie, Red belt, Black Leather shoes and Maroon socks.

Girls : L.K.G. to VII:- Maroon tunic, Cream shirt, Red belt, maroon tie Black leather shoes, Marron socks and maroon Ribbon.

VIII to XII:- Maroon salver, cream Kurta, Maroon Kofi, Black leather shoes, Maroon socks, maroon ribbon.

SPORTS UNIFORM

Boys : White pants and House coloured T-shirt.

Girls : White skirt and House coloured T-shirt, white ribbons.

All should wear white shoes and white socks. Designs (colours) on white canvas shoes will not be permitted.

ATTENDANCE

1. Regular 90% of attendance is a must for promotion.
2. Half day leave Will not be granted to students. Once they come to the school, they have to attends the Whole day, unless requested by parents in case of an emergency.
3. In case of serious illness that requires absence for more than five days, the principal must be informed in writing and the medical certificate must be presented to him by the parent. The Principal can grant only 15 days leave, and another 15 days can be had through production of medical certificate.
4. Student and teacher have to, attend the morning assembly. Late comers, shall not enter the class ; but report themselves to the principal / teacher designate, habitual late coming will not be tolerated, but will be seriously viewed.
5. Regular attendance in class is an important factor of good education . Hence for every absence, a written request signed by the parents must be made in the Handbook. This should be produced on attending the class the day after the absence, and be countersigned by the class teacher.
6. Leave of absence will be granted only on valid and serious reasons.
7. Absence of more than 30 days at any rate will be reason enough for detention.

HOME-STUDY AND PARENTAL CO-OPERATION

- 1.. Parents are expected to co-operate with the School authorities by enforcing regularity and discipline in the children They have to prepare a time table for home study and supervise their assignment . They may help them preparing their daily lessons.
2. Reports about Students, if any from the school are conveyed through the handbook. Parents are expected to take note of these reports and messages with their countersignature. They may confer with the principal and through him with the teachers concerned.
3. Students who fail to show these remarks and reports and get them countersigned by their parents are liable to be punished and sent home .
4. Parents, guardians or other persons are never allowed to meet the students or teacher during class hours at the door of class rooms. On emergencies they may contact the principal, in the office.
5. Teachers may be contacted on Saturdays after 12.00 PM. On the other days an appointment could be made in advance with a request through their ward in the handbook.
6. In all communication with the school, the name standard and section of their children should be clearly mentioned. Parents are also requested to notify the school office in writing of any change in their address, or telephone number immediately.]
7. Private tuition before or after class hours , are generally discouraged. It may spoil the studious nature of students in classroom. The untrained and unqualified tutors can impose a heavy burden on them, wasting their energy and time and at the same time causing an additional financing burden on parents . The students thus get no time to relax, to play games etc.

STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT IN UNIFORM WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ATTEND CLASS.

1. On School days the children are to wear neat and tidy School uniform.
2. Girls having short hair should not let it fall all-over the face, but should hold it back by either a hair band or rubber bands which should be in maroon colour .
3. Girls are not permitted to wear any Jewellery, besides simple small gold ear rings and watch with black straps. Fancy or big ear rings, finger rings, anklets or chains, necklaces bracelets, tattoos and mehendi are not permitted in the school.
4. Boys are not allowed to have Mustache or to grow their hair and should have hair dressed periodically.

EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION

1. The School follows CBSE guideline for examination.
2. Examinations are held as indicated in the school Diary and student will have to clear all the dues before the last exams otherwise the result will not be given.
3. The school conducts no Re-test/Re-examination. There is no provision for reassessment or promotion on trial.
4. If a pupil fails to reach regularly the minimum marks of 33 for a pass in all subjects, he/she will be detained.
5. Marks and remarks indicating promotion or failure duly signed by the Principal are to be considered final.
6. No separate examination will be held for a student who is absent in any examination. Daily performance of the students will be taken into account at the time of promotion to the next class. However, if student goes out for a school related programme separate arrangement will be made.
7. No double promotion is granted.
8. If a child has failed consecutively for two years, he or she will be issued T.C
9. In all cases of promotion or failure the Principal's decision is final. Parents should see the report cards are collected on the date communicated by the school. They are also requested to examine the report cards carefully and see that their children make a special effort & study those subjects in which they are weak

SCHOOL FEES

Regulations :

1. Fee should be paid in instalments on or before the date given in the fee card.
2. A penalty of Rs.20 per instalments will be charged for delayed payment.
3. Students shall not be allowed to appear for examinations unless all dues are paid.
4. There will be an upward revision of 10-15% of fees per annum.

CONVEYANCE

1. The School Provides Conveyance facility to its students by plying school buses.
2. School provides transportation facilities for students. They have to register their names with all the details of boarding and alighting points etc. , by filling up the columns on the last inner page of this handbook, before they pay the fee of transportation .
3. Parents who want to send their children by the school bus should previously apply to the principal. The bus fee should be paid along with the tuition fee. The fee is charged according to the distance.
4. The school bus will not wait for the late comers. Those who make use of the school bus are requested to be ready at the bus stop five minutes before the schedule time.
5. To discontinue the use of the bus a written request must be made **one Month before**. Students misbehaving in the bus and the defaulter of fee will not be allowed to continue the use of the bus service. The school bus is directly under the control of the principal. Any suggestion or complaints may be made only to the Principal and not to the bus staff.
6. **On extra class or special class day bus facility will not be avail to the students. They Should arrange their own Conveyance.**

GENERAL RULES FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. It is the fact that without the co-operation of the parents, the work of educating a child is impossible. The child in the last analysis is the product of both Home and School. Thus Parents/Guardians are requested to co-operate with the School authorities in re-enforcing the educational values neatness, politeness and courtesy in manners both in the home and at School.
2. Every effort made by the teacher and the management will go in vain unless the parents co-operate with them wholeheartedly and supervise the daily work and studies made by their wards at home. The normal intellectual, moral and cultural development as well as their character formation depends on their co-operative efforts. After each assessment, the parents get a report of their ward's conduct, aptitude to study, progress etc. as on the marks card.
3. It is impossible to educate the child without good example and co-operation of the Parents/Guardians with the Principal and Staff. A Parent/Guardian should respect the Principal & Staff at all time. Parents / Guardians shall not criticize the Principal /Staff in front of Children. It does more harm to the children than to the Staff. Any complains with regard to educational matters or any suggestion for improvement shall be made to the Principal in the office or in writing.
4. Two specimen signatures of the parents must be given, preferably of father and mother, who will be responsible for signing the Remarks or Leave Record pages in the School diary.
5. The School authorities are not responsible for the safety of any child after school hours. Necessary arrangements should be made to take the children promptly home after class.
6. The School raises its fund for day to day expenses from the parents / Guardians on different heads. The School fee may be enhanced time to time depending on the financial requirement of the school. There may be 10-15% increase in the fees per annum.

7. Student in Deepti Convent School implies on the part of the parents willingness to comply with the requirements
8. All are expected to reach the school at least 10 minutes before the time fixed for the morning school Assembly and take active participation in the common morning prayers. Late comers should get the clearance from the office before entering the class-room after which they will go to their respective class rooms. Late comer's record is maintained in the school diary.
9. Students should not ride their cycles in the school premises
10. No students is allowed to leave the school campus at any time, during school hours without the due permission of Principal, **Students will not be sent home with anyone other than the parents/guardians.** Permission is granted only for unforeseen reasons.
11. A gate pass will be issued from the office without which the watchman on duty will not allow the child to leave the campus.

SCHOOL REGULATIONS

1. **Students should bring the school dairy everyday.**
2. Students shall arrive to the School at least 10 minutes before warning bell for the assembly. The School gate will be closed after the 1st bell.
3. Improperly dressed students will be excluded from the class room. Students, who are habitually untidy and improperly dressed, will not be allowed to sit in the class. Students are required to attend School in the prescribed uniform.
4. No student should leave the School premises without Principal's permission.
5. English must be spoken at all times in the School premises.
6. Students must be present on the re-opening day without fail.
7. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience and conduct injurious to the moral tone of School are reasons for dismissal of a student
8. Parents/Guardians are requested to enforce regularity and discipline and see that their children prepare their lessons and do their home-tasks.
9. Parents should deposit the School fees before the dates given in the fee card. A fine of Rs. 20/- will be charged to default of payment of fees after the due date. Pupil's name will be struck of the register in case of non-payment of fees for two consecutive months.
10. No student is permitted to drive any motor vehicles with out licence.
11. Cycle must be kept locked in the cycle stand. School would not be responsible for theft or damage. However, action will be taken against any student who steals or damages any cycle.

12. The School is not responsible for loss of any good belongings to the students. They are not permitted to bring any dangerous articles such as knife, blades, guns etc.
13. Students of class X, XI, XII who are attending practical classes will be charged general breakage on less costly items of glass ware etc. and on articles which are used individually by the breakage charges will be levied separately.
14. All Must wear ID Card in the School Premises.

LEAVE RULES

Regularly, alertness & revision are essential for the student's progress for which co-operation of the parents is solicited.

1. If, for any reason a child has to miss school there must be a **prior permission** from the school authorities.
2. All absence from school, even with a prior permission must be explained by the parents in the Absence Record provided in the school diary, before it can be condoned & the student is admitted into the class room. A student who fails to bring the diary daily signed by the parents in the absence record will be asked to go home and so the parents concerned are to make sure that the absent record is maintained and duly signed.
3. If the leave is more than 3 days, a prior written permission could be taken or besides the note in the school diary an explanation separate letter must be added and sanctioned by the Principal. Leave is granted only for grave reason.
4. A student returning to school after suffering from an infection suffering from a contagious disease should produce a medical certificate of fitness declaring him/her out of quarantine, before the student could be admitted into the class.

5. Repeated absence without a written leave or absence for more than 15 days consecutive days renders a student's name stuck off the rolls. Re-admission if granted will be done on payment of a re-admission fee is Rs. 500.
6. All are expected to attend the classes on the last working day before the start of the vacation and the opening day after the vacation. All defaulters will have to pay Rs. 50/- fine for each day.
7. Presence of 15th August and 26th January and other common occasion of the school is compulsory. The absent student has come to school with parents the next day or else Rs. 100/- will be charged.
8. **For student of Class IX-XII 80% attendance is compulsory for appearing in the examination [on due reason 75% attendance is considered by the principal]**

ALL STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO:

1. Show respect to all the teachers & staff members.
2. The students are expected to put on school uniform and come to school, during the holidays or any other time if the students are called for any practice by the school authority or teachers.
3. Avoid shouting, whistling or running about in the school building.
4. Avoid throwing papers, chalks, stones etc. anywhere in and around the school premises but put in the dustbin provided for the purpose.
5. Observe all the rules of good conduct on the streets while coming to or returning from school.
6. Strict silence is to be observed at the freeze bell in the morning, after the recesses and in the passages.
7. To be admitted to the class room, those who come late must show the class teacher their Regularly Record duly signed by the Principal or, Moderator of Discipline.
8. Students should always keep their books and text books neatly and orderly.

N.B- Children who are ill should not be sent to school to attend class or to take tests as the chances are that they will spoil both their health and studies. In case of illness application for leave must reach the school without delay. Once a pupil has come to school he/she will not be allowed to go home before time.

NATURE OF SCHOOL

This school is an unaided Christian minority school, which includes classes from **PLAY GROUP** to **XII**. The curriculum of the Council for the **Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi** is followed and the students are prepared for the **CBSE Examinations**.

The medium of instruction is English. Hindi, and Sanskrit are offered as second language and third language.

Since education at **Deepti Convent School** is conducted through the medium of English, a high standard of English is required for success in the **CBSE Examinations**. Therefore, the use of English in the school campus is compulsory for all.

TEXT BOOKS AND EXERCISE BOOKS

For Parents' convenience, timely availability and for the sake of uniformity the school books both text books are made available in a particular shop. However, if the parents wish to obtain the books or uniform from any other shop, without compromising with the colour and quality may freely do so.

GUIDELINES TO STUDENTS FOR EXAMINATIONS

1. After the freeze bell, all revision should come to an end and all the students should keep their books outside their respective examination room, collect their writing board, pen etc. and then come to assembly for prayer.
2. After the assembly move to your respective examination halls.
3. Follow the bells for the examination.
4. When you get the question paper you will be allowed to read it for 15 minutes. Then bell will be rung to start the exam.
5. Attend carefully to any general instructions that may be given at the head of the question paper. Do not waste paper by skipping some lines.
6. Write your name; roll number, subject and date on the right hand of your first sheet.
7. Get the signature of your teacher on every sheet of your answer sheet. If there is no signature it will not be corrected.
8. Remember that handwriting and spelling will be taken into account. Use of calculators or any calculating machines are not permitted.

9. As soon as warning bell is given, arrange your answer booklet as order, the first page at the top, See that they have your name and roll number written on them. Fasten them together at the left-hand corner and hand them over to the invigilating teacher.
10. At the last bell, all must put down their pens and no more writing is permitted.
11. Do not borrow any items from your neighbour, you must arm yourself with all that you require eg: extra pens, pencil, eraser, scale etc.
12. All the rough work, should be done on the same sheets as the rest of the answer. No separate paper will be given.
13. Do not take out unused paper out of the exam room.
14. **Use of unfair means:** If any student found guilty of
 - 1) Bringing in answer sheets and detected copying
 - 2) Taking out of attempting to take out answer sheets or using chits.
 - 3) Disturbing others or any disorderly conduct will be penalized
15. A pupil who uses unfair means during Tests/Examinations will be given zero in that subject and debarred from writing the remaining examinations. **Repetition of unfair means** will make the pupil liable for dismissal

3. माता-पिता को देखना चाहिए कि उनके बच्चों आवश्यक पुस्तकों एवं सामग्रीयों के साथ विद्यालय आएँ । जो छात्र आवश्यक पुस्तकें लाना भूल जाते हैं और जिन्होंने विद्यालय की वर्दी नहीं पहनी हो उन्हें घर वापस भेज दिया जाएगा ।
4. छुट्टि से संबंधित आवेदन माता-पिता या अभिभावकों को लिखित रूप में देना होगा । यदि कोई छात्र अस्वस्थता के कारण अनुपस्थित रहता है तो इसकी सूचना प्रधानाध्यापक को देना अनिवार्य है ।

SUSPENSION AND DISMISSAL

Freedom and Responsibility are the basis of discipline. We expect the students to accept the atmosphere of the school and learn in a free, co-operative manner. Freedom and responsibility have to be learnt slowly and freely accepted in an atmosphere in which students exercise judgment and make free choice about matters appropriate to their age and level of understanding. Student's mistakes are tolerated as part of the process of learning but repeated misbehavior against the spirit of the school, hindering other students from peacefully learning is not tolerated even if this causes pain to the parents of the stubbornly non co-operative students. The Principal reserves to himself the right to dismiss any student from the school, whose conduct is, in his opinion, against the moral tone of the school, Immorality in word or deed, willful damage to the school property, grave insubordination, contempt of any school authority, unsatisfactory progress in studies and lack of diligence are sufficient grounds for dismissal. The Principal is the sole judge regarding the dismissal of a student. The parent/guardians, when they apply for the child's admission to Deepti's are understood to have accepted her judgment in such matters as final.

The Principal also reserves to himself the right to suspend a student from attending the school and determine the period of suspension, depending on the gravity of the particular situation.

LIBRARY RULES

1. Students are required to maintain strict discipline and silence during library time and should leave in proper order on completion of their premise.
2. Only a pen and notebook is permitted inside the library. All other materials are to be left outside.
3. No tracing of any book or map is permitted as the articles may get damaged in the process. Any damage caused will have to be made good by the students concerned.
4. Books must be handled carefully so that no damage is done to any book.
5. No books shall be taken out of the Library without due permission of the Principal and Librarian concerned.
6. Books should be examined by the borrower before leaving the Library and if the book is damaged the Librarian should be notified. Damage sustained by the books while out of the library will be laid to the borrower's account and he will have to make good the damage. Writing of any kind in the books is punishable with a fine.
7. Books are not to be kept for more than 7 days. They may however be kept for a further period of 7 days if they are again issued.
8. A fine of Rs 25/- per day will be charged on each book, which is not returned in time. No book will be issued to any student with such a fine, until it has been paid.
9. All books must be returned before all the major holidays take place.
10. Before the book is returned to the Library, the necessary entry should be made in the handbook on the page reserved for the same.

COMPUTER LAB RULES

1. The Computer Lab is a place of learning and serious work. For this "Silence" is a very necessary element. **OBSERVE STRICT SILENCE.**
2. Dust is the greatest enemy of the computer, **REMOVE SHOES BEFORE ENTERING THE ROOM. WEAR CLEAN SOCKS.**
3. Take nothing into the computer room without the prior permission of the teacher, **CD's & Pen drives** are not permitted.
4. The computer is a complicated electronic instrument which is learned through instructions and operation.

5. Follow the instructions of the teacher carefully. The computer is a very delicate and expensive machine. Damages must be paid for by the student. REPORT IMMEDIATELY ANY KIND OF DEFECT OR DAMAGE, SO THAT PROMPT ACTION MAY BE TAKEN AND THE MACHINE IS AVAILABLE FOR THE NEXT USER.
6. Computer time is precious, DON'T WASTE IT.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. The School gives great importance to co-curricular activities of many kinds. Thus, we try to draw out the best in the students helping him/her to develop all the latent skills and talents.

The important co-curricular activities are : computer activities, handicraft, audio-vidio programs, dance both Eastern and Western, Instrumental and vocal music, painting gardening , class magazines, public speaking, leadership camp, school band, stamp collection, flower arrangement , School newsletter, NCC roller skating, social services etc.

2. **The science club** : Fosters students' interest in science and technology and enables them to develop their latent talents and power of investigation and research. It also arranges talks by eminent persons on scientific topics, film and video shows , trips to places of scientific importance, science exhibitions, quiz competitions, debates etc. both on local and inter-school basis, thus it develops the competitive spirit too.
3. **The Literacy Club** : Encourages the students to expose and develop their inborn talents to the fullest extent. Several competitions and cultural programs are held to groom them to face inter-schol competitions. The literary forum organizes literary and cultural meetings every week.

4. **The IT club** : Endeavors to create an awareness of the latest developments in the software and computer technology . It enables the members to prepare themselves for taking up computer work as a profession in future.
5. **The Music Club** : Gives opportunities to develop one's inherent fine qualities through voice training and lessons musical instruments, thus making one appreciate the wider world of music.
6. **Athletics and Games** : The students are divided into four houses : Blue, Green, Yellow and Red, and are given coloured uniforms, which they have to wear every Wednesday. Mass PT, and coaching in athletics, games, roller skating, and other physical activities are given regularly. House wise competitions and displays are arranged occasionally. The annual sports day crown the year's activities.
7. **The Social Action Forum** : Tries to develop in the students a civic sense of charity and gives them opportunity to work for the social uplift and relief of the poor in their suffering Students who are good in studies and having a helping nature are selected to form a social action forum. They will help to maintain discipline among students and cleanliness in and around the class rooms and to undertake social work for the underprivileged.
8. **The cultural Club** : School gives lots of opportunities for self-expression and advancement of the cultural heritage. On . Saturdays there are special programmes like dramatics, dance, music & fine arts. Every child gets the opportunity to participate. Every Saturday various competitions at School - level, Inter - School level are organized by the School to promote the children.
9. **Recreational Activities**
We celebrate all festivals & important days through recreational activities. Arts and crafts give a lot of creative opportunities to the students. Every child participates as per in his/her time table, in the arts and crafts work, where minimum 'B' grade is required to get promoted. They learn making stuffed - toys to origami, match - stick work, clay - modeling, cardboard - modeling, instrumentation etc. All these creativities of the whole year are displayed in the Annual Art & Craft Exhibition.
10. **Smart Classes**
In-order to make teaching & learning processes more interesting,

smart classes with the use of digital boards have been introduced, for all classes from Nursery to XII.

11. **Clubs**

Clubs like 'Ecology Club', Magazine Club, Social Service Club, Photography Club, Science Club, Maths Club, E & I Club, Arts Club, Quiz Club, Literary Club etc. have been formed in the school. Students' active participation in all these fields, under the guidance of teachers, helps to develop the personalities of the children, in all dimensions.

12. **Career Counselling**

Career counselors are invited by the school from time to time for the Counselling of the students of classes X to XII, to help them in choosing the best career- option in future.

13. **SMS Facility**

Looking to the increased mobile usage, the school has started informing parents about the child's progress, holidays & other important details through SMS facility. Parents can also receive and respond to all the informations through SMS.

14. **Closed circuit cameras**

Each & every area of the school is equipped with closed circuit cameras which help in close supervision of the classes & students.

15. **Monthly Parents - Teachers' Meetings**

To keep a very good rapport between parents and teachers for the betterment of the child, on the 2nd Saturday of every month, we conduct Parents - Teachers' Meeting. Teachers meet parents of every child at least 10 times in a year for the child's welfare / growth in

AWARDS/REWARDS

The school believes in recognizing the talents of the students and encouraging them for their meritorious performance by offering a variety of academic and non-academic prizes and certificates in various fields.

1. **General Proficiency Certificates:** For students of Classes I to X showing overall proficiency in academic.
2. **Merit Certificates:** For students showing exemplary performance and active participation in school activities or possessing extra ordinary talent in non-academic field.
3. **Sports Certificates & Prizes:** For winning inter-school or inter-house competition.

PARENTS ARE ALSO REQUESTED

1. To be a living example of the values taught and expected of their children.
2. To keep the school authorities informed of any special problem. Family circumstances or other relevant facts those are necessary for a proper understanding and guidance of their children.
3. Not to bring/send Tiffin, books/other articles etc. to their wards during school hours.
4. Personal memo page should be carefully filled in by the parent at the beginning of the academic session. Change of residence /phone nos. should be notified to the school office immediately.
5. Giving presents to staff or other demonstrations of gratitude or goodwill in their honor is not allowed. Discourage your child to bring gifts for his/her classmates.
6. Any communication (request or complaint) made by the parents must be addressed to the Principal and not to the class teachers.
7. Parents are particularly expected to sign the Principal's or teacher's remarks. Failure to do this may put their children to great inconvenience.
8. Kindly see that the child attend the school in proper prescribed uniforms.
9. Be patient with your children and encourage them.
10. Parents are requested not to ask for leave for their wards to attend weddings and other social and religious functions during the term and it is not at all encouraged.
11. Guardians or escorts will not accompany the student right to the classroom.
12. Students must bring with them all the articles needed for the day. Guardians should not insist in the office/ gate to forwards articles/Tiffin to the students during class hours.
13. Parents and guardians are requested to specially note the following. They are requested to co-operate with the school at all times. If they have any problem, they are requested to meet the Principal individually to sort the problem for the good of their children.
14. Children should do their home work, projects, charts etc. by themselves. Parents or their tutors should not do it for them. It is important that the children develop a habit of studying and working on their own.

15. Criticism of teachers and the school authorities in front of their children by the parents should be avoided. Should they have any legitimate complaint, meet the Principal according to the office time.

However it is not expected of our school parents/guardians of the following:

- a. Indulge in any propoganda that tarnishes the image and name of the school and the staff.
- b. Alert the media and forcefully enter the school campus.
- c. Signature campaign and distribution of leaflets and handbills.
- d. Congregating in front of the school without permission for prolonged meetings against the school.

N.B Any such behavior or action which is intended to hurt or mark the good image and reputation of the Management, administration, teachers, and students of the school will lead to the removal of the child from the school.

PLACE OF SOLITUDE

The school provides a place of solitude (prayer room) which is used by students and staff members to meet their spiritual needs through prayer and reflection, etc. Every working day, before or after the class, during free periods or during intervals, they can spend a few minutes in silence here. On special occasions, like the Principal's day and teacher day, Children's day prayer service is conducted to absorb the spirit of the day.

Moral instruction

To build up the character of the students, to create faith in God to make them understand true meaning of life and to inculcate in them ethical and moral values, religious and moral instruction are offered to all the students. As a part of this program, meditations, prayer services annual retreat, seminars etc. are conducted periodically.

HOUSE SYSTEM

For effective management and discipline of students and to create and foster ' a Spirit of Co-operation' among them to develop deep love and devotion towards their Alma Mater, a house system has been developed in the school . Thus school students are divided into four houses distinguished by four colours in their uniforms. A healthy

competition is encouraged among them to achieve the standard of excellence and to develop higher qualities of leadership . The houses are led by their captains and vice captains, who take inspiration and guidance from their house masters and house mistresses.

PICNICS AND TOURS

1. Class teacher of all divisions will plan together for a one day tour finalize the destination, date and time with detailed program. Tours shall not be very close to assessment.
2. All picnics and tours shall be arranged with the prior approval of the principal . She shall be furnished with the complete details of participants, itinerary and schedules in advance. On return, a detailed report of events and expenses incurred shall be presented to the principal.
3. School authorities, management or staff will not be held responsible for any accident or mishap during picnics tours or excursions. A written document signed by the parents to this effect shall be given to the office through class teachers one day before they start.

SCHOOL CABINET

1. The school cabinet consists of the school leaders, assistant leaders, secretaries, captains and vice captains of the four houses.

- To speak only English in the school premises.
- To be always friendly with one another in and out of the school.
- To avoid vulgarity in our talk and behaviour.
- To accept whatever work is assigned to us as our rightful share and duty.

- To keep standing when any Sister, Teacher or Visitor enters or passes through any room in which we happen to be.
- To be courteous to and sport man-like with opposing teams and with officials
- To respect the beauty of the school premises and report any damage which may occur.
- To maintain perfect silence in the library and the laboratories.
